 175 TRAY OF VEGETABLES
 The tray is for a display of three dishes of vegetables,
 arranged for effect, from the following eight. The quantity of
 each vegetable is given in brackets: Carrots (3), Cauliflower
 (3), Onions (3), Parsnips (3), Peas (6), Potatoes (3),
 Runner Beans (6), Tomatoes (6).

For classes 174 and 175 only: 1st £5; 2nd £3; 3rd
 £2

Each individual dish of vegetables on the tray shall be
 judged to a maximum of 20 points. This
 shall be split into three allowing seven points for freshness,
 7 points for condition and 6 points for uniformity. The
 vegetables should be displayed within an area of 18" by 24"
 without bending any part of them. No part of any exhibit
 should exceed the size of the tray.

A black base cloth is permitted, and the tray may be
 painted. Parsley is permitted for garnishing, but no other fo-
 liage or accessories such as plates, sand, rings etc. will be
 allowed.
